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INTERDISCIPLINARY CONNECTIONS: ENRICHING THE STUDY OF MEXICAN CULTURE

Workshop Leader: Sandi Hammonds

For Teachers of Spanish or Social Studies, grades 8-12

3 hours of instruction time

Maximum number of workshop participants: 30

Teachers discover how the study of visual art can enrich language acquisition and appreciation of other cultures. At this workshop, participants explore the art and culture of Mexico through two art strategies: 1) Aesthetic Scanning, a systematic method for critically analyzing and responding to art, and 2) Point of View, an approach that encourages students to examine the point of view of an artist from another culture. Applications for making connections to other cultures and other areas of the curriculum are discussed.

TEACHING LITERACY STRATEGIES THROUGH VISUAL ART

For Teachers of Grades 5-12

3 hours of instruction time

Maximum number of workshop participants: 30

How can students gain skills in questioning and making inferences from a text? In this workshop, the “text” is a work of visual art. Beginning with a visual image allows students to learn the skills that they will apply later to more abstract texts (language). In this workshop, teachers examine techniques for helping students develop their questioning strategies—posing relevant questions to gather information and progressing to more in-depth inquiry about the artwork. Teachers will be able to help students engage in higher levels of thinking as they guide them in examining unfamiliar objects and making inferences about the people and the culture that produced them.
