# **MOVING THROUGH SCIENCE**

Creative movement provides an opportunity to reach all learners, particularly the kinesthetic learner, in ways that allow them to process and retain information effectively and efficiently. In this workshop, teachers examine ways to enhance the teaching of science topics, such as the rainforest habitat, water cycle, rock cycle, plant life cycle, and states of matter, through movement. Participants explore how to involve students in active learning through warm-ups, improvisation, and simple structures for composing dances.

# LEARNING TO MOVE, MOVING TO LEARN: EXPLORING SCIENCE WITH YOUNG LEARNERS

Creative movement takes advantage of young learners' natural inclination to move and harnesses it for exploration, expression, and meaning-making. In this workshop, teachers experience ways to enhance student understanding of grade-level appropriate science content and vocabulary through guided movement activities, improvisations, and the creation of dances. Teachers will explore the states of matter through movement and apply this process to create a movement sequence to demonstrate another scientific concept that they teach. Each teacher receives a CD to bring the music for movement back to the classroom.

The sponsor's purchase of the CD, *Dancing Between the Lines: Music for Movement in the Classroom*, for each participant is required.
